

**MINUTES OF THE WORK SESSION OF
THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF WEBER COUNTY**

Discussion and/or action for approval of minutes for the Commission Work Session held on June 15, 2026

Commissioner Harvey made a motion to approve the minutes for the Commission Work Session held on June 15, 2026. Commissioner Bolos seconded the motion. All voted aye. The motion carries.

Discussion on URS Public Safety Rate Increase – Emily Wilde, Steffani Ebert, Chris Crockett

Emily Wilde discussed URS public safety rate increases, where public safety contributions would increase by 1.25% while public employee contributions would increase by 0.49%. Both Emily and Steffani Ebert provided options for handling the increase, with the Commissioners ultimately deciding to support picking up 0.76% of the 1.25% increase to equalize the percentage increase between public safety and public employees at 0.49%. This decision will cost approximately \$12,000 and will be formalized through a resolution by next week before the July 1st implementation date.

Discussion regarding Written Permission for Motorized Vehicle Access on Conservation Easement Property - Tammy Aydelotte, Sean Wilkinson, Rick Grover, Courtlan Erickson, Tucker Weight, Chris Crockett

Tammy Aydelotte discussed Powder Mountain's request for written permission to allow motorized vehicle access on conservation easement property for installing a lift. Courtlan Erickson explained that the conservation easement allows such requests unless they interfere with wildlife or conservation values, and both the county and Ogden Valley Land Trust must grant permission. The Commissioners gave their approval, with conditions requiring a written agreement that includes a revegetation plan to restore vegetation to existing conditions.

Discussion regarding ICAC Software Licensing - Sheriff Ryan Arbon, Julie Stoddard, Sargent Dustin Stewart, Chief Josh Gard, Chris Crockett

Sheriff Arbon discussed implementing ICAC software licensing for digital forensics, with Sergeant Stewart presenting details about the \$42,000-45,000 annual licensing cost which would allow the Sheriff's Office to process electronic devices locally instead of waiting 1-2 years for the state RCFL. The technology would include GrayKey software for bypassing iPhone encryption and could process multiple devices simultaneously, significantly reducing the time required for digital evidence examination. The Commissioners gave their approval to the Sheriff's Office to start with county agencies and potentially expand to other regions, with plans to develop a fee structure for external agencies in the future.
