Stacy Skeen (Commission Office): Submitting name of Gary Adams to fill midterm vacancy created after passing of a board member.

2. APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION 18-2022 AMENDING RESOLUTION 4-2006 WHICH ESTABLISHED AN ADMINISTRATIVE CONTROL BOARD AND DELEGATED CERTAIN POWERS TO THAT BOARD TO GOVERN THE OPERATIONS OF THE WEBER AREA DISPATCH 911 AND EMERGENCY SERVICES DISTRICT.

Tina Mathieu (Weber County 911): Changes related to House Bill 22. Changes reference the statute itself to avoid having to update the Resolution every time the statute changes.

Commissioner Froerer moved to approve Resolution 18-2022 amending Resolution 4-2006 which established an Administrative Control Board and delegated certain powers to that board to govern the operations of the Weber Area Dispatch 911 and Emergency Services District; Commissioner Harvey seconded. Roll Call Vote: Commissioner Froerer – aye; Commissioner Harvey – aye; Chair Jenkins – aye

3. APPROVAL OF FINAL READING OF ORDINANCE 2022-10 AMENDING THE FEE SCHEDULE FOR THE WEBER COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE.

Chief Aaron Perry (Sheriff Dept): No changes from First Reading. (From First Reading: Fees apply to work Sheriffs are asked to do outside of normal Sheriff duties worked on overtime. Supervisor fee added to allow support of larger events. Fees paid by event organizer.)

Roll Call Vote: Commissioner Froerer moved to approve final reading of Ordinance 2022-10 amending the fee schedule for the Weber County Sheriff's Office; Commissioner Harvey seconded.

4. APPROVE A CONTRACT WITH WEBER SCHOOL DISTRICT TO HOLD THE LEAP FESTIVAL AT THE OGDEN ECCLES CONFERENCE CENTER AND THE PEERY'S EGYPTIAN THEATER.

Kassi Bybee (OECC): Slightly different contract bringing 800 6th grade children. Use of the theater, part of conference center, lower ball room, and '100' series rooms for breakouts.

Commissioner Harvey moved to approve the contract with Weber School District to hold the LEAP Festival at the Ogden Eccles Conference Center and the Peery's Egyptian Theater; Commissioner Froerer seconded. Commissioner Froerer – aye; Commissioner Harvey – aye; Chair Jenkins – aye

5. APPROVE A CONTRACT FORT BUENAVENTURA MOUNTAIN MEN FOR THE MOUNTAIN MAN EASTER RENDEZVOUS TO BE HELD AT FORT BUENAVENTURA.

Todd Ferrario (Culture, Parks, & Rec): Updated three year version of current contract. They do a phenomenal job and we want to continue that partnership.

6. APPROVE A CONTRACT WITH THE STATE OF UTAH – GOPB TO PROVIDE FUNDS FROM AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT OF 2021, CORONAVIRUS STATE FISCAL RECOVERY FUND, TO FUND THE CONSTRUCTION OF A LOW INCOME RESIDENCE AT 9TH AND WALL.

Andi Beadles (Weber Housing Authority): \$1.9M of ARPA funds for 48 units of affordable housing with all one bedroom units. Open house will be held for local residents to learn more and share concerns.

Commissioner Froerer moved to approve the contract with the State of Utah – GOPB to provide funds from American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund, to fund the construction of a low income residence at 9th and Wall; Commissioner Harvey seconded.

Scott Perkes (Planning): Long term plan to bring wayfinding and signage in the Ogden Valley to one design theme. This long term contract lays out who, how, and when maintenance will occur for the installed signage.

Commissioner Freorer moved to approve a Cooperative Agreement with UDOT for the placement and maintenance of wayfinding signage within UDOT rights-of-way of the Ogden Valley; Commissioner Harvey seconded.

2. Public Hearing for consideration on a requested development agreement and a rezone from A-1 to R-1-10 on approximately 19.47 acres (ZMA 2021-10).

Steve Burton (Planning): 58 lots. Brad Brown represents property owners. Develop Agreement and associated rezone Ordinance under consideration today. On February 8th Planning Commission unanimously recommended approval with conditions:

- 1. Development to tie in with adjacent development (JDC Ranch), and
- 2. Developer waived right to protest annexation into Plain City.

Commissioner Froerer: Public should be fully informed, not fair to make decisions on case-by-case basis, especially when so close to completion of West Weber General Plan.

Steve Burton: Proceeding with approval is recommended since this land will be eventually annexed into Plain City.

Commissioner Froerer: It is not currently part of Plain City or Farr West. And in the event that annexation does not happen, we have to live with current zoning.

Steve: Both current and updated general plan show this property as annexed.

3. Public Comments:

Brad Brown, 719 W 4953 S, Riverdale: Feel this is a good addition to the county. Went through County due to sewer requirements. Worked with local county sewer district and got annexed. Worked closely with JDC to align streets, trails, etc.

Brian Baliss, Nielsen Homes: Working with Brad Brown, fully supportive of what they are doing.
