# 5. APPROVE A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH WEBER SCHOOL DISTRICT TO DEVELOP A FORMAL COLLABORATIVE PARTNERSHIP BETWEEN THE CENTER OF EXCELLENCE AND WEBER ADULT EDUCATION.

# 6. APPROVE AN AGREEMENT WITH WEBER-MORGAN HEALTH DEPARTMENT TO DETECT AND MITIGATE THE SPREAD OF COVID-19 IN HOMELESS SERVICES SITES AND OTHER CONGREGATE LIVING FACILITIES.

Melissa Freigang (Executive Director, Weber Prosperity Center of Excellence): Held.

Commissioner Froerer moved for approval of an agreement Weber-Morgan Health Department to detect and mitigate the spread of COVID-19 in homeless services sites and other congregate living facilities; Commissioner Harvey seconded.

### 7. APPROVAL OF A LOCAL FUNDING AGREEMENT WITH HARRISVILLE CITY TO ESTABLISH THE TERMS RELATED TO THE WEST HARRISVILLE ROAD PROJECT.

Brooke Stewart (Community Development): Widen and improve 0.18 mile stretch from 1200 West to 1030 West on the south side of West Harrisville Road. This work aligns with the section of roadway to the east of 1030 West being widened and improved with federal grant funding. Once complete, the improved sections will provide a uniform and safe roadway with 2 travel lanes in each direction and a center lane from highway 89 to 1200 West. The project was recommended for funding by WACOG and approved by the County Commission as part of the 2021 Transportation Priority list in November 2021. Harrisville City has secured the right-of-way needed for this project. This agreement outlines the terms related to Sales Tax Funds that are programmed for construction in 2024.

Commissioner Froerer moved for approval of a Local Funding Agreement with Harrisville City to establish the terms related to the West Harrisville Road Project; Commissioner Harvey seconded. Commissioner Froerer – aye; Commissioner Harvey – aye; Chair Jenkins – aye

## 8. APPROVAL OF A LOCAL FUNDING AGREEMENT WITH PLAIN CITY TO ESTABLISH THE TERMS RELATED TO THE PHASE 3 OF THE NORTH PLAIN CITY ROAD PROJECT.

Brooke Stewart (Community Development): Third and final phase of the North Plain City Road project will widen and improve 1.3 miles of roadway along North Plain City Road from 3300 West to 4200 West. The project was recommended for funding by WACOG and approved by the County Commission as part of the 2021 Transportation Priority list in November 2021. The city is committing local matching funds to complete the project. This agreement outlines the terms related to Sales Tax Funds that are programmed for construction in 2024.

Commissioner Froerer moved for approval of a Local Funding Agreement with Plain City to establish the terms related to the Phase 3 of the North Plain City Road Project; Commissioner Harvey seconded. Commissioner Froerer – aye; Commissioner Harvey – aye; Chair Jenkins – aye

# 9. APPROVAL OF A LOCAL FUNDING AGREEMENT WITH MARRIOTT-SLATERVILLE CITY TO ESTABLISH THE TERMS RELATED TO THE MARRIOTT-SLATERVILLE CITY 1700 S. 1200 W. PROJECT.

Brooke Stewart (Community Development): and improve 1.1 miles of roadway along 1700 South and 1200 West from 12<sup>th</sup> Street to the city boundary. These improvements will align with the section of the roadway to the east that Ogden City previously improved with local funds. The project was recommended for funding by WACOG and approved by the County Commission as part of the 2021 Transportation Priority list in November 2021. The city has received a grant from the Surface Transportation Program and the City will also be contributing local matching funds to complete the project. This agreement outlines the terms related to Sales Tax Funds that are programmed for construction in 2024.

Commissioner Froerer moved for approval of a Local Funding Agreement with Marriott-Slaterville City to establish the terms related to the Marriott-Slaterville City 1700 S. 1200 W. Project; Commissioner Harvey seconded.

# 10. FINAL APPROVAL OF SUN CREST MEADOWS SUBDIVISION PHASE 3, CONSISTING OF 9 LOTS, LVS102220.

Steve Burton (Planning): Nine lots in Sun Crest Meadows last phase. Western Weber Planning Commission has seen this twice with final approval coming December 8<sup>th</sup>, 2020. Water will-serve and final approval letters are completed. Subdivision improvement agreement of \$400,086.65 provided by the developer. Subdivision meets all zoning and subdivision requirements. Staff recommends approval. Sewer already was there to support previous phases; Phase 3 sewer ties in from existing Phase 2 sewer lines.
