3. APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION 50-2021 OF THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF WEBER COUNTY APPOINTING MEMBERS TO THE OGDEN MUSICAL THEATRE ADVISORY BOARD.

Kassi Bybee (OECC) presented four names for appointment to the board for second terms. Annette DeFries, Jolene Žitto, Sasha Clark, and Karen Bristol.

Commissioner Jenkins moved for approval of Resolution 50-2021 of the County Commissioners of Weber County appointing current members (Annette DeFries, Jolene Zitto, Sasha Clark, and Karen Bristol) to a second term on the Ogden Musical Theatre Advisory Board; Chairman Harvey seconded.

4. APPROVAL OF A CONTRACT WITH THE UTAH INDIGENT DEFENSE COMMISSION ALLOWING WEBER COUNTY TO APPLY FOR FEDERAL FUNDS THROUGH THE UTAH INDIGENT DEFENSE COMMISSION FOR REIMBURSEMENT OF UP TO 50% OF THE AMOUNT SPENT ON LEGAL REPRESENTATION FOR THE PARENTS OF CHILDREN WHO ARE CANDIDATES FOR TITLE IV-E FOSTER CARE.

Bryan Baron (Attorney) federal program providing money for admin costs. Attorney fees now covered under that program. Expected reimbursements up to \$250k per year.

Commissioner Froerer moved for approval of contract with the Utah Indigent Defense Commission allowing Weber County to apply for federal funds through the Utah Indigent Defense Commission for reimbursement of up to 50% of the amount spent on legal representation for the parents of children who are candidates for Title IV-E foster care; Commissioner Jenkins seconded.
